Share your views on the future of maternity, neonatal and children's surgical services in North Central London

There are just a few weeks left to share your views as part of a public consultation on proposed changes to how and where maternity, neonatal, and children's surgical services could be provided in North Central London. These proposals aim to improve access, experience and outcomes for pregnant women and people and their babies, but need your input.

The proposals have been developed by NHS doctors, midwives, nurses, and other health professionals, working together with families with experience of these services. Hundreds of staff and local residents have already shared their views and we are keen to hear from as many people as possible about their experiences and views.

North Central London Integrated Care Board, on behalf of the local integrated care system, and NHS England (London) Specialised Commissioning are consulting with an open mind. No decision has been made yet and it would be some years before any of the proposed changes are implemented. Until then all services are running as normal.

Share your views on the future of maternity, neonatal, and children's surgical services in North Central London

Everyone is invited to share their views on the future of maternity, neonatal, and children's surgical services in North Central London in public consultation running until 17 March.

The Start Well consultation is being jointly run by NHS <u>North Central London (NCL)</u> <u>Integrated Care Board</u>, and <u>NHS England (London) Specialised Commissioning</u>. No decision has been made yet and the NHS is consulting with an open mind. If a decision is taken later this year, it would be some years before any of the proposed changes are



implemented and until then all services are running as normal.

The proposals relate to how and where maternity, neonatal, and children's surgical services could be provided in North Central London and aim to improve experience, access, and outcomes for both patients and staff and make services sustainable in the long term. They have been developed by doctors, midwives, nurses, and other health professionals, working together with families with experience of maternity, neonatal, and children's surgical services.

The proposals include reducing the number of hospitals in NCL delivering maternity and neonatal care from five to four and closing the birth suites at Edgware Birth Centre. These proposed changes could help to create more resilient services and co-locate midwife and obstetric led units with neonatal units that are able to look after premature or unwell babies. Home birth services would be available across all NCL boroughs. Whichever option is selected, there is a commitment to investing an additional £40 million in maternity and neonatal hospital buildings and facilities to provide the best possible environments for parents and babies, as well as staff.

For children's surgery, the proposals include creating two 'centres of expertise' at Great Ormond Street Hospital and UCLH which could mean quicker and better-quality care for babies and small children who need operations.

Hundreds of staff and local residents have already shared their views and we are keen to hear how the proposals could impact you and your family before any decision is made.

Anna Stewart, Programme Director for Start Well, said 'We want to hear from as many people as possible during the consultation, to help make the right decisions for this area so that everybody can access the very highest quality NHS care.

We need to understand what the impact of these proposals would be on local people. It's really important you talk to us. So please do take this opportunity to feed back your thoughts so we can hear the widest possible range of voices during the consultation period."


