



Adult vaccinations and when to have them

18 Years to
64 Years and
in a clinical
risk group



★ Flu vaccine – given every year from September to March

50 Years and
Immunosuppressed



★ Shingles vaccine (two doses given between 8 weeks to 6 months apart)

65 Years



★ Shingles vaccine (those turning 65 from the 1st September will be eligible for Shingles, two doses given between 6 to 12 months apart)

65 Years
and older



★ Pneumococcal vaccine (One dose required)
★ Flu vaccine – given every year from September to March

70 Years to
79 Years



★ Shingles vaccine

75 Years to
79 Years



★ RSV vaccine
